


Mr. Crouch is a 66-year-old male who admitted to **Willowbrook Nursing & Rehabilitation Center** on 3/13/2024 and was readmitted on 4/10/2024 from an acute care hospital after his home health therapist found him to be living in unsafe conditions following discharge from our facility.

PT evaluated Mr. Crouch on 4/11/2024 where he was able to perform bed mobility and transfers with Maximum Assistance and propelled himself 20-feet using a wheelchair. Prior to his hospitalization, Mr. Crouch required Assistance for all ADL's and IADL's and was recommended to continue therapy services during his first admission. He was very receptive and demonstrated more insight with regards to his condition and functional deficits. PT set goals to focus on improving his strength, functional transfers, balance, and functional mobility, with the goal of discharging to his stepdaughter's home.

OT also evaluated Mr. Crouch on 4/11/2024. During his evaluation he required Maximum assistance with performing all toileting tasks and toileting transfers. He required Maximum assistance for self-care and grooming/hygiene tasks and during all Activities of Daily Living. OT set goals to address increasing his ability to improve dynamic sitting balance during ADL's and promote safety awareness during functional task performance of self-care tasks, and also his safety during functional mobility and transfers with Modified Independence.

Following 31 days of skilled nursing and therapy services, Mr. Crouch made significant functional gains with PT and was able to perform all bed mobility and transfers with Minimal Assistance. He was able to propel his wheelchair **100+<u>ft</u>** with a Manual Wheelchair. He made gains with OT and is able to demonstrate safety during Activities of Daily Living as long as he has Minimal Assistance. Therapy recommended he have care provided to improve his safety and maintain his ability to complete Activities of Daily Living at home. Mr. Crouch was able to safely discharge to his Granddaughter's home on 5/10/2024 with home health services of his choice.



MDS Section GG Functional Scores

06 - Independent
Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper
05- Setup or clean-up assistance
Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists
only prior to or following the activity.
04 - Supervision or touching assistance
Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard
assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided
throughout the activity or intermittently.
03 - Partial/moderate assistance
Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports
trunk or limbs but provides less than half the effort.
02 - Substantial/maximal assistance
Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk
or limbs and provides more than half the effort.
01 - Dependent
Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to
complete the activity. Or the assistance of two or more helpers is required
for the patient to complete the activity.
